#### Risk Assessment was updated: 08/03/2021

As a school, we must protect people from harm. This includes taking reasonable steps to protect our workers and others from coronavirus. This is called a COVID-19 risk assessment and it'll help us manage risk and protect people. We must:

- · identify what work activity or situations might cause transmission of the virus
- think about who could be at risk
- decide how likely it is that someone could be exposed
- act to remove the activity or situation, or if this isn't possible, control the risk

In the UK some rules such as social distancing may be different in each of the devolved nations. However, HSE regulates in all of these countries. For our school we should check the public health guidance for the country you are in:

• England

The school's classes which are populated with young children from 4 years of age up to 11/12 years of age.

We follow strict guidelines. Parents are not allowed in the school premises or its car park and we sterilize rooms and toilets at every interval and change of class, also the windows are open during the whole day to provide adequate ventilation to the classes. Also, we have established a staggering start and finish schedule of the classes in order to avoid gathering of pupils and we are using three separate doors for access to the school property. In addition, we are measuring the temperature all the pupils one by one before they enter the school with electronic contactless thermometers.

The majority of our teachers work at primary English schools and therefore they are having Covid tests twice a week. For those who are not, they are using rapid Covid tests to comply with the regulations. As we believe that the Health and Safety of our pupils and Teaching staff is of a paramount importance especially now.

Older children and adults have classes during the week. We continue with online classes with the adult classes and with older children who do not take any exam. Only classes with students that need to be assessed or take mock exams will attend in person.
